

306 Commercial II - Reflected Ceiling Plan Basics

A few key concepts will aid in the implementation of basic ceiling **FEATURES** and the appropriate selection of fixtures for your space.

- A few typical lighting symbols, found on a reflected ceiling plan, are listed to the right. Note that the symbols DO NOT reflect the fixture itself – rather they denote the TYPE of fixture. Sizes of the symbols vary depending on the paper layout and scale of the drawing.
- Try to space fixtures in rows evenly (example: lighting a circulation path) if you are providing general illumination. Think about, or visit similar spaces to get an idea of fixture spacing, and the types of fixtures that successfully provide atmosphere, ambient lighting, and decorative lighting.



3. In the area that requires varied ceiling height(s), think simple and effective features such as soffits and coves. Take inspiration from books and presentation given in class. The finalized ceiling design should have a consistency of design vision that CLEARLY illustrates these ceilings have been designed and coordinated!
