COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is an educational lecture series designed to provide the student with knowledge of color used in the interior design profession. This course is a study of "Color" as a key design element with its applications to the practice of interior design. Emphasis will be placed on using color in combination with the principles of design to gain a holistic view of color and design theory.

Upon completion of this course, students will be capable of demonstrating and applying the necessary practical and theoretical properties of color to the built environment. The course will present content through a variety of lectures, mixed media, guest speakers, field trips, and reading assignments.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- To provide concepts and a progression of projects that will allow the student to observe the importance of color when considering the aesthetic, functional, and psychological needs involved in solving problems in interior design.
- To demonstrate an understanding of color principles, theories, and systems
- To develop an understanding of the interaction of light and color and the impact they have on one another and interior environments
- To become aware of psychological insights into the perception and use of color in interior design
- To demonstrate understanding of how color relates and changes under varying conditions in interior spaces
- To develop an understanding of and the ability to appropriately select and apply color with regard to its multiple purposes
- To develop an understanding that social and cultural norms may vary from their own and are relevant to making appropriate design decisions
- To develop an understanding and the ability to appropriately apply theories of human behavior

- To demonstrate student ability to integrate oral and visual material to present ideas clearly
